

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Shipbrook Road Residential Development



Uxbridge Commercial Development

Structural and civil engineering design associated with the re-development of an "island" site located in the commercial centre of Uxbridge in Middlesex. The existing development consists of 2, 3 and 4 storey reinforced concrete frame housing mixed uses above a basement carpark occupying the full "island" area of the



site. The re-development project consists of the addition of 2 to 3 additional storeys of residential accommodation above the existing retail / residential facilities and the demolition of the offices and replacement with a 10 storey budget hotel.
